What Does True Repentance Look Like?

(You) Create (*bārā'* – to bring into existence, to create out of nothing, *ex nihilo*) in me (personal) a clean (*ṭāhōr* – clean, pure, genuine, free from moral impurity) heart (*lēb* – the immaterial part of man, the seat of a person's mind, will, knowledge, volition, and emotions), O God (*'elōhiym* – the One True God, the Creator and Sustainer, the Sovereign One),

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Both *bārā'* and *'elōhiym* are used in Genesis 1:1.

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and (You) renew (*ḥādaš* – to restore, reestablish on a new or improved basis, to revitalize and make new or like new) a steadfast (*kûn* – to be marked by firm determination or resolution, to be unshakeable, to stand upright) spirit (*rûaḥ*) within me (personal).

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To recapture and restore the unshakeable determination of spirit that was once held, yet has over time, slowly slipped away.

What Does True Repentance Look Like?

(You) Do not cast (*šālak* – to throw, fling, to toss casually away, to dispose of) me (personal) away from Your (God) presence (*pāniym* – face, being before or in front of someone, proximity),

What Does True Repentance Look Like?

and (You) do not take (*lāqah* – grasp, seize, take away)

Your Holy (*qōdeš* – sacred, sanctified, set apart and consecrated to God) Spirit (*rûah*) from me (personal).

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David had experienced in the past some of the comfort, counsel, help, quickening, and power of the Holy Spirit, whom he did not have dwelling in him permanently. Yet the thought of losing the Spirit's presence, or grieving the Holy Spirit, was his chief concern.

What Does True Repentance Look Like?

(You) Restore (*šûb* – to turn, return, to back, do again, to bring back into original existence, use, function or position) to me (personal) the joy (*śāśôn* – exultation, gladness, rejoicing, jubilation, an emotion of great happiness and pleasure) of Your (God's) salvation (*yēša'* – deliverance, rescue, help, preservation, the act of delivering from sin or saving from evil),

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and (You) uphold (*sāmaḵ* – sustain, support, bear up, establish, to supply with everything needed) me (personal) by (what) Your (God's) generous (*nādiyb* – willing, noble, an attitude of heart that consents or agrees, magnanimous, is disposed or inclined towards, gladly willing) Spirit (*rûaḥ*).

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and (You) **uphold** (*sāmak* – sustain, support, bear up, establish, to supply with everything needed) me (personal) by (what) Your (God's) generous (*nādiyb* – willing, noble, an attitude of heart that consents or agrees, magnanimous, is disposed or inclined towards, gladly willing) Spirit (*rûah*).

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God is not only able to uphold David by His Spirit, He is also gladly willing to do so, despite David's sin.
